Literacy

This term, we will be writing adventure stories (Flat Stanley), stories from the Ancient Egyptian culture (myths), recounts and diary entries.

Topic

Our topic this term is 'The Big Dig'. This is a historical unit focusing on archaeology with our main focus being the Ancient Egyptians. We will locate Egypt within the world, look at the chronology of the civilisation, compare our modern world to that of the Ancient Egyptians, look at Gods and Goddesses, pyramids and pharaohs

Science

In science this term, we will learning about plants and animals including humans. We will also have our SRE units of work towards the end of the term.
