Choose at least one activity a week. Bring it in and share with the class when you are finished.

<p>Dig a hole in your garden. (check with an adult before you start digging) Draw and label anything you find. This could include living things</p> <p>★ ★</p>	<p>Create your own Heptathlon. Choose 7 activities to be completed. Compete against yourself, and try to improve your score, or compete against your family.</p> <p>★ ★ ★</p>	<p>Create a treasure hunt for someone. There should be at least 10 steps and, instructions using half/quarter turns and forwards/backwards (No left/right)</p> <p>★ ★</p>	<p>Imagine you, and another person of your choice, have been shrunk to 15cm tall for a day. You are at you home. What would you do? Give an hour-by-hour breakdown.</p> <p>★ ★</p>	<p>Choose 10 containers from your kitchen. First predict which has the biggest and smallest capacity. Then use a measuring jug to work out their capacity. Were you correct?</p> <p>★ ★</p>	<p>Research and compare the Roman and British Empires. How were they successful? How did they fail? Get blank world maps and colour in each empire (at its peak). What do you notice?</p> <p>★ ★ ★</p>
<p>Find 2 stories, one with a good King/Queen and one with an evil King/queen. Read them and write about their similarities and differences.</p> <p>★ ★ ★</p>	<p>Research the lifecycle of a mammal. Present as an explanation text with illustrations (could be repeated for a bird, amphibian or insect)</p> <p>★ ★ ★</p>	<p>Read a news article. Write a list of facts and a list of opinions from the article. Was it easy? Were your results as you expected? What do you notice?</p> <p>★ ★</p>	<p>Plant 2 seeds (from the same plant) in different places. Observe and compare how they grow, keeping an illustrated diary of your observations.</p> <p>★ ★</p>	<p>Choose a page from a book you are reading. Make tally chart of prefixes and suffixes used on that page. Which is most common?</p> <p>★</p>	<p>Draw a floor plan for your house. Label with the perimeter and area of each room. (At least 5 rooms, to the nearest metre)</p> <p>★ ★ ★</p>
<p>Go outside and find as many seeds as you can find. Write an illustrated list of any you find.</p> <p>★</p>	<p>If you were king or queen for a day what would you do? Write and draw about your day</p> <p>★ ★</p>	<p>Design and make your own crown or tiara. (★ ★ for design only)</p> <p>★ ★ ★</p>	<p>Make a poster with the title: How are seeds dispersed? Include facts and diagrams of the different methods.</p> <p>★ ★</p>	<p>If you could choose to be king or queen of any country in the world which country would you choose? Why?</p> <p>★</p>	<p>Using squared paper create a symmetrical pattern. The mirror line could be vertical, horizontal or even diagonal.</p> <p>★</p>
<p>Research and write a profile for a King or Queen from a different continent.</p> <p>★ ★</p>	<p>Find out a little about tapestries. Sew a picture or pattern.</p> <p>★ ★</p>	<p>Read a story about a king or queen. Write a book review for it.</p> <p>★ ★</p>	<p>Write an extra chapter or alternative ending to a book you have read.</p> <p>★ ★ ★</p>	<p>Design your own palace. Draw a floor plan for it</p> <p>★</p>	<p>Find out about Clare Castle, particularly any links to royalty. List 10 interesting facts about it.</p> <p>★</p>
