 - I just don't get it. The lessons are confusing.



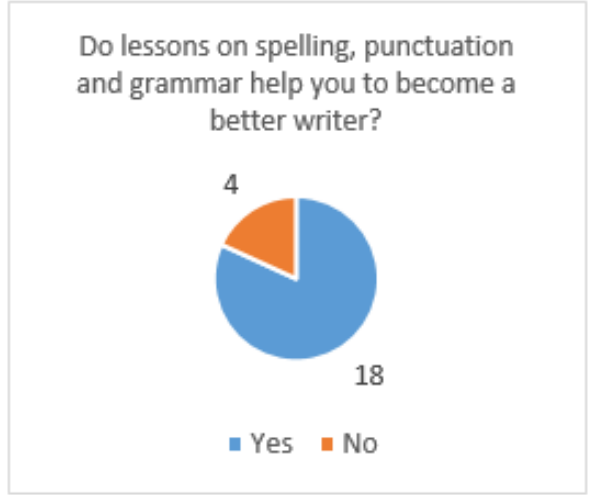
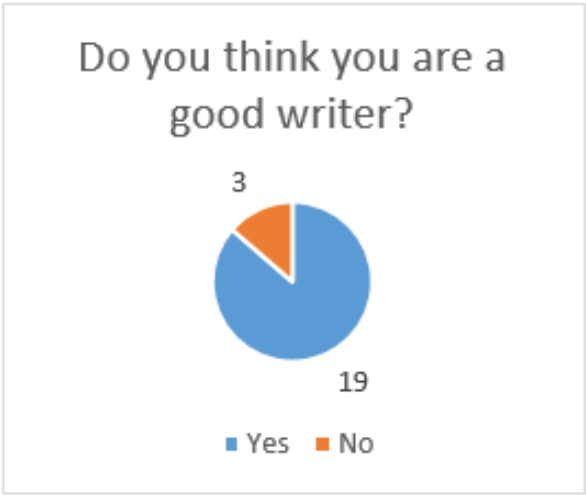
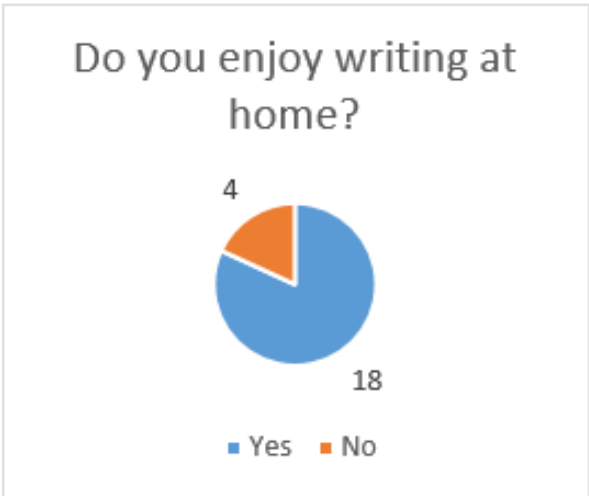
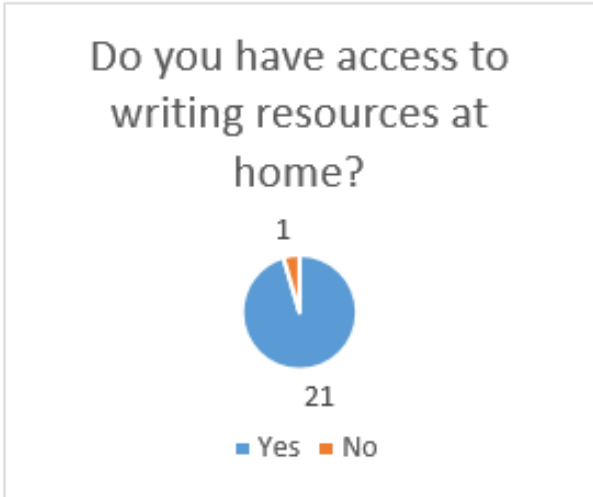
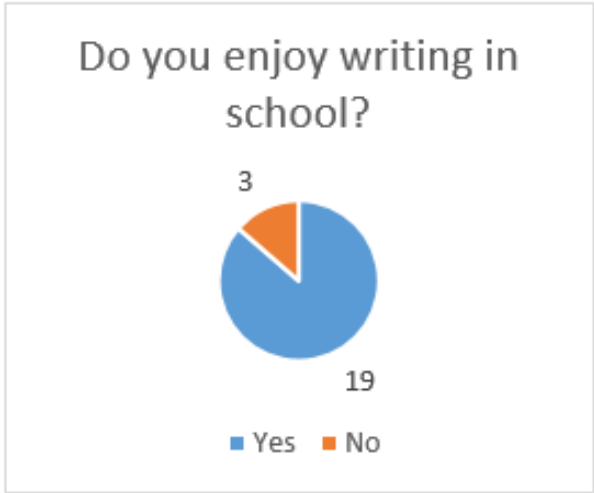
6) Why is it important to be able to write accurately and confidently?
