

ATTENDANCE

If your child is absent from school, please ensure that you ring the school office before 9.30am with a specified reason for their absence. If a reason is not given, we are obliged to phone you back so that our records are correct. If a child has been sick, then they should be away from school for 48 hours after the last bout of sickness.

We encourage parents to send children into school with coughs or colds, or a temperature. If we feel that a child is too ill to be in school, then we will always contact you, but they often perk up during the day, once they are into their normal routine.

Children with head-lice should be sent into school once the head-lice have been treated; I cannot authorise whole-day absences for this reason, but I will always be sympathetic if children need to be late due to the treatment for this.

Our Breakfast Club continues to run every morning from 7.45-8.45pm., led by Joey Kettle, one of our very able Sports Coaches from Dellar Sports. Joey offers a range of activities from reading and craft to bowling and coordination activities followed by a nutritious breakfast and a personal handover to the child's class teacher. 
