
#### Parkrun Wednesday, 4th July 3.30-5pm

## **Extended Services Proposal**

Following an extremely positive response from our parental survey with 49 parents (79% of those surveyed) stating that they would use an after-school club if it were offered by the school, we will be trialling an after-school club from September 2018 for a term, initially. The Catkins Club at Clare Community Primary School will provide Out of Hours Care for our pupils both before and after school. All pupils, from Reception to Year 6, will be eligible to join this club which will be held in its own dedicated room and take full advantage of the wider school facilities such as the school hall and outside areas. Both clubs will be run by our experienced and dedicated staff, in conjunction with Dellar Sports Coaching. Our aim will be to provide a range of stimulating activities in a safe and caring environment.

#### **Opening Times**

Afternoon sessions will run from 15:00 to 18:00 every day during term-time. Children in Reception and KS1 classes will be dropped off at the club by their class teacher, and children in KS2 collected by a member of staff at 15:15. If your child is attending an after school activity club, they will be escorted to Catkins Club by a member of staff after this has finished.

#### Fees

Fees must be paid via Parentpay. All sessions must be paid by the end of the month. Clare Community Primary School reserves the right to withdraw the place from your child and refuse further bookings following non-payment of fees.

Breakfast session (07:45-08:45) £3.25 Afterschool short session (15:00/15-16:30) £6 Afterschool full session (15:00/15-18:00) £13.00 Childcare vouchers will be accepted.

Fees will not be refunded unless the Catkins Club is cancelled for any reason. *Please note that children attending afterschool clubs and requiring childcare afterwards will need to be booked in for full sessions.* 

#### Registration

A Registration Form must be completed in full for each child attending either one of the clubs. These will be available from the school office next week and can be downloaded from our website. A child will not be allowed to attend either club if the Registration Form has not been received. It is the responsibility of the parent/carer to inform the school/club of any changes, e.g. contact details.

#### Menu

We will offer a range of healthy snacks at 4'oclock and children staying till 6pm will be served a basic meal at 5 o'clock.

#### Activities

These will be relaxed and flexible in a calm and comfortable environment, recognising that children need to unwind and relax after the school day. They can choose whether they wish to join in with a range of planned, structured activities both indoor and outdoor such as those involving sport or choose quiet reading and board games, or even to do their homework!

#### **Collecting your child**

Children will need to be collected from the front entrance. Once there, please buzz, and wait for a member of staff. There will be a charge of £5 for late pick-ups.

#### Policies

Our Extended Services form part of our whole school offer, adopting the school's policies and procedures. Children will be expected to respect the ethos and values of the school while attending these clubs as they would during the school day.

#### Safeguarding and First Aid

All staff have received comprehensive training in Safeguarding and First Aid. Any minor accidents or incidents will be dealt with in the usual way following Clare Community Primary School First Aid Policy and parents will be notified on collection. Parents/ carers will be contacted immediately should the child need to be taken home or receive further medical treatment.
