One important thing that we are considering is a change of times to the length of our school day. You are probably aware that compared to other primary schools in the area, it is short.


We are proposing an extension to the school day for children in Years 3-6 from 3pm to 3.15pm. Not only will this provide a vital 15 minutes extra learning

#### **School Clubs**

There are some places left in some of our school clubs, so please contact the office if you would like to know availability. If you are picking up from an After-school club, the normal rules regarding our school carpark apply-no one apart from staff should be using this.

### Safeguarding and After School Pick-ups

It is vital that you inform the office before 2.30pm if you wish to change collection arrangements for your child. We have had a few parents phoning the office after 3pm to say that they wanted their child to go home with another parent or not go on the bus. This is alarming for your child and compromises our safeguarding arrangements, so please do inform us early if there is an issue or the normal pattern needs to be changed. A letter is attached to this regarding Year 5s and 6s walking home— we will not be able to release the children unless we have a signed consent form for our records.



## **Up to Date Medication**

During the annual review of our arrangements for children who need to have medication in school, it has come to light that a lot of this medication is out of date, or does not have clear instructions in place regarding doseage and storage. You will shortly be receiving a form to fill in if you child does need to keep medication in school; it is your responsibility to provide us with up-to-date instructions and medicine.



Just a reminder that we will be supporting **OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD** as usual this Christmas. Shoeboxes can be dropped off at school between 1-18th November, and we hope to make this a competition between our four houses to see which house can bring in the most shoeboxes between them. This is a wonderful charity for the children to support, meaning that they can get involved in giving at firsthand, and know that their donations have a direct effect on another child's happiness and wellbeing.


#### Fill with gifts

Small donations welcome on the day


