Thank you so much for your support over the new playground arrangements. A lot of parents have commented personally to me how they feel that their children have responded well to a more structured beginning to the day and we certainly feel that everyone is benefiting from an orderly and calm start to the morning.

The number of children who are late to school seems to be reducing and I thank you for your efforts to get your children on the playground by 8.45. It is my aim to completely eradicate lateness and I will be speaking to the children to encourage them all to think about how they get ready for school in the morning, and how it is their responsibility to make sure that they are organized and well behaved for you when

you are trying to get them to school on time. Believe me, I know this tricky time of day only too well myself! Obviously there might be the rare occasion where things fall apart, but that should be unusual rather than a weekly occurrence.

Linked to this, we will not be allowing children to phone home if they have forgotten book bags or homework. I'm sure you will agree that part of getting older is accepting responsibility for our own mistakes, and delivering forgotten items to individual classes can take up a lot of valuable time for our hardworking office staff first thing in the morning.

Likewise, attendance is monitored very carefully by myself and Mrs Wiffen on a weekly basis, and I would encourage you to send children into school if you have the slightest doubt about whether they should be off or not. If we think a child is genuinely ill, we



will always send them home.

Thank you for your patience with our technological issues last week- we are now fully resourced and working at full capacity. The vast majority of parents are using Parentpay effectively and this saves the office staff a lot of time in the morning chasing up payments and dinner choices. Please remember to book your child's meals a week in advance because we are not able to book meals on the day as exact numbers are catered for with only a very small margin for error.
