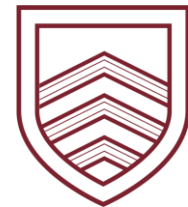




Our Approach to Assessment

Our curriculum is ambitious and engaging, and assessment helps us ensure every child makes good progress and feels confident in their learning.

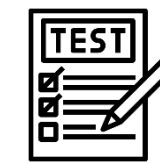

Subject Assessments

Phonics

Checked regularly in EYFS and Year 1

National phonics check in Year 1 & retested in Year 2 if needed.

Reading

Termly reading tests and teacher judgement

Year 6 use practice SATs papers

Writing

Termly spelling and grammar checks

Teacher judgement based on independent writing

Maths

Termly maths assessments

Focus on arithmetic and reasoning

Year 6 use practice SATs papers



Early Years (EYFS)

In Reception, assessment is based on observations during play and everyday activities.

Learning through play

Teacher observations

Progress towards Early Learning Goals

We focus on how children learn as well as what they learn.



Formative Assessment - Every Day Learning

Used daily by teachers to guide teaching and support children.

- ✓ Questioning in class
- ✓ Observations and discussions
- ✓ Marking and feedback
- ✓ Quizzes and short checks
- ✓ Work in books and on whiteboards
- ✓ Online learning tools (e.g. Accelerated Reader, Spelling Shed, TT Rockstars)

→ This helps teachers spot gaps or misconceptions quickly and adapt lessons.



Summative Assessment - Termly Check-ins

These assessments happen three times a year and help us understand progress over time.

Reading

Writing

Maths

Children are assessed as:

- Working Below Expected
- Working Towards Expected
 - Working At Expected
 - Working At Greater Depth

This information helps teachers plan support and challenge where needed.



National Assessments - Statutory Checks

Some assessments are set nationally:

EYFS - Good Level of Development (Reception)

Phonics Screening - Year 1

Multiplication Check - Year 4

SATs - End of Year 6

These help us compare progress nationally and ensure children are well prepared.
